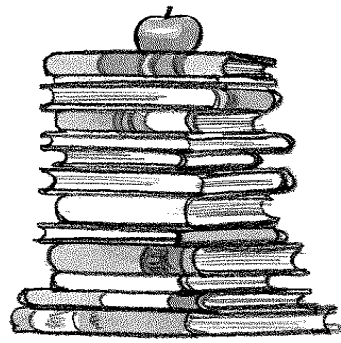

School-based Prevention Education Programs



WORKSHOPS FOR TEACHERS/YOUTH LEADERS ON CHILD ABUSE, CHILD SEXUAL ASSAULT, AND OTHER FORMS OF VIOLENCE

The Sexual Assault & Trauma Resource Center of RI offers a variety of trainings for teachers and other adults who work with children and teenagers. The programs outlined below can be general or orientated towards adults or teens who work with children in a specific age group. Sessions can be scheduled according to individual needs, and programs can be customized for specific groups. PDC's and CEU's are available for many programs.

General Workshop on Child Sexual Abuse (1 hour program)

Information about sexual abuse; victims and offenders; why children tell and why children do not tell about sexual abuse; what to do if you suspect that a child has been abused; and how to respond and help a child who discloses abuse.

Identifying and Responding to Child Sexual Abuse (2-hour program)

Myths and facts; information about both victims and offenders of child sexual abuse; normal versus problematic sexual behavior; effects of sexual abuse on children; responding to disclosures; and reporting laws.

Identifying and Responding to Bullying Behavior (2 hour program)

Myths and facts about bullying; different forms and types of bullying; what children report; techniques in how to effectively respond to victims, bystanders, and offenders; and effective measures in reducing bullying behavior in school.

Responding to Sexual Harassment in School (1 hour program)

Identifying sexual harassment; information about both victims and offenders; normal versus problematic sexual behavior; why many students do not disclose sexual harassment; effects on students; and how to effectively respond.

General Overview of Child Abuse (2 hour program)

Information about bullying, physical, sexual, and emotional abuse of children; signs and symptoms of abuse; what to do if a child discloses abuse; and community resources.

All programs can be tailored to meet specific needs.

Cost: Fees for the Sexual Assault & Trauma Resource Center's educational and training programs vary by type of program.
